# THE LONGEST SPEECH IN BUDGET HISTORY

The Finance Minister presented the Union Budget 2020 amidst several challenges- unemployment, demand slowdown, India's derailed economic growth- to name a few. The government tried addressing most of the issues dwindling growth but in an attempt to address multiple themes, the budget missed out on the most important expectation- boosting demand.

Let's see some of the highlights:

#### Personal Tax:

Income Bracket (₹)	Tax %
5 to 7.5 lakhs	10
7.5 lakhs to 10 lakhs	15
10 lakhs to 12.5 lakhs	20
12.5 lakhs to 15 lakhs	25
Over 15 lakhs	30

Since the new taxation system omits key exemptions and deductions, this tax regime should be beneficial for people with a lower number of investments or no investments at all.

- Insurance on bank deposit: The budget announced an increase in the bank deposit insurance cover to ₹ 5 lakhs from existing ₹1 lakh. This is a good move. (Remember PMC?)
- **Dividend distribution tax:** The government decided to remove dividend distribution tax on companies. From now on, the tax will be shifted to recipients at the applicable rate. The objective is to make India a more attractive market for investment.
- LIC IPO: LIC will be listed as part of the government disinvestment initiative, as per the new budget. The decision has not gone down well with LIC employees' unions. Will there be repercussions? Only time will tell.
- Transport Infrastructure: It was announced that 100 more airports will be developed by 2025.
  1,150 trains will run under the public private partnership (PPP) mode. Can we expect more jobs?
- Education: The government has allocated a substantial amount for the education sector. It has promised to soon announce a new education policy. An additional amount has also been allotted for skill development. Steps will be taken to attract foreign direct investment in the education sector. There are plans to allow degree level full-fledged online education programme by institutions ranked in top 100. Experts feel that this is a move in the right direction.





- Agriculture: The government announced a 16-point action plan to boost the agriculture sector. The budget also announced special rail and flight services for the transportation of farm produce. The aim is to double farmers' income by 2022. The government promises to assist 20 lakh farmers in setting up stand-alone solar pumps and another 15 lakh farmers solarise their grid-connected pump sets.
- Manufacturing: Manufacturing did not get much share in the government's budget for 2020-21. Some schemes might be introduced for manufacturing of mobile phones and electronic equipment. Some amount was allocated for the BharatNet programme which was a welcome move by the telecom sector. But those who were expecting concessions for manufacturing companies in key sectors like automobiles were left disappointed.

**Reaction:** The Sensex encountered its biggest single-day plunge in more than a decade after the Union Budget failed to live up to market expectations of growth-boosting measures. Stocks slumped as a proposal to scrap the dividend distribution tax for companies failed to impress investors.




